## EASY, EASY, EASY FOR ELIAS BROMAC

Three year old **Elias Bromac** made it look easy on debut when he won at Wairarapa yesterday – January, 2nd.

Drawing seven behind the mobile over 2000m on the grass, he was not rushed early and settled back in the field. Come the 1000m mark and he made a quick three and four wide move to surge around the field, ending up in the suicide spot.

Straightening up he was allowed to balance himself and halfway down the long straight surged clear to win going away.

The final margin was an easy one and a half lengths with the last half in 59.9. The overall time was 2:38.8 and the mile a rate of 2:07.7.

**Elias Bromac** is the second successful foal of the well bred **Rose Vear**. Her first foal was an unraced **Christian Cullen** filly who was exported to Australia for stud. The **Falcon Seelster** winning **Highview Winston** came next followed by Elias Bromac. She is currently in foal to **Mach Three**.

Rose Vear is a **Holmes Hanover** half sister to 1:54 performer Metekhi and former **NZ 3YO Filly of the Year** Copper Beach who numbered the NZ Oaks and Victorian Oaks among her nine wins and has already produced in her first foal, a filly that has surpassed her own career.

That filly is the 1:54 winning De Lovely who was **NZ's 3YO Filly Pacer of the Year** last season and is closing on over \$600,000 lifetime just halfway through her four year old season. She has won 5 group one races to date including the NZ and Australian Oaks.

Rose Vear's dam Les Payzen Star is a half sister to, among others, former **NZ Harness Horse of the Year** Elsu, now a successful sire.
