DUST BUNNY JUST TOO TOUGH AGAIN

His official name is **Dustin Bromac** but commentator Mark McNamarra seems to think that "**the Dust Bunny**" fits him just as well and it does .. for last Friday night he simply ground his rivals into the dust.

Widest on the gate at the start he settled last before making a three wide sprint with a lap to go and ending up in the death at the 800m mark. From there he simply waited through the fast sectionals until they straightened up for the run in, and then it was a matter of survival of the fittest.

Leader Another Homer kept fighting, early leader Lionels Meddle came through along the inner and Dustin Bromac just refused to lie down and held his ground. This win made it his 9th consecutive cheque.

The 1950m journey was covered in 2:22.2, a mile rate of 1:57.3 with fractions of 57.1 and 28.3.

Dustin Bromac has now won over \$66,000 in stakes with 6 wins and 13 places to date. Four of those wins have come in his last nine starts, three of them at Addington.

For a horse that drew eight or wider in 8 of his 9 starts as a juvenile Dustin Bromac has never been over run with lots of luck, but now, because he has had to learn the game the hard way - at four years of age he is a mentally tough racehorse and "the Dust Bunny" should be grinding dust into his opponents for a while yet.
