

KYLIE BROMAC TAKES SUB 2:00 RECORD AT REDCLIFFE

Kylie Bromac, a half-sister by Falcon Seelster to fast USA winning mare Ulrica Bromac (1:49.6, 14 wins & \$250,339), took a sub 2:00 record herself at Redcliffe, Queensland, on Thursday, October 5.

Given a good run on the outer from the five gate by trainer Peter Greig, Kylie Bromac finished best to win in a 1:59.3 rate for the mobile 1780m.

This was her second win 20 starts and her first win in three starts this season.

Ulrica Bromac (by Union Guy) is now the dam of a winner in North America in Ave Ulrica (p2, 1:56.4f), three wins for over \$30,000.

Universal Kim, the Holmes Hanover-Kim Bromac dam of Kylie Bromac and Ulrica Bromac, won one of 15 starts, saluting at Blenheim in 1998 for Burnham trainer Bruce Negus (of Courage Under Fire fame) in a 2:01 rate (2300m).

She died two years ago but made a good contribution at stud, with Kylie Bromac being her last foal.

Her first foal, Una Bromac (by pacing sire Live Or Die), won eight times trotting and ran 15 placings for \$85,222, and has bred on, leaving former top young Sundon trotter in Escapee (1:57.4, 11 wins & \$272,783), the 2011 NZ 2YO Trotting Filly of the Year, the 2012 NZ 3YO Trotting Filly of the Year and the 2013 NZ 4YO and older Trotting Mare of the Year; and Needle (three wins).

Escapee's list of feature wins included both the NZ and Northern Trotting Derbys', NZ Trotting Oaks, Hambletonian Classic and a Victorian Trotters Cup at Melton, for owner Trevor Casey, from the Allstars stables of Mark Purdon and Natalie Rasmussen.

The trotting theme also came through with another of Universal Kim's foals in the unraced Ursula Bromac (sister to Una Bromac), who left good Continentalman trot winner Ushaka Bromac (1:59.3, 16 wins & \$144,985).

Ursula Bromac, to pacing sire Badlands Hanover, has also left the pacing winners, Put Your Lights (p3, 2:00, 11 wins), Badlands Bromac (2:00.1, six wins) and Garbo (one).

Universal Kim was also the dam of the ill-fated Ula Bromac (TT, 1:58.5), by Badlands Hanover, who died before leaving any foals, and minor Mach Three winner, Violet Bromac.

Further back, Universal Kim's third dam Bachelor's Advice, was an unraced half-sister to top NZ pacers, Golden Oriole (1964 NZ Sapling Stakes & Great Northern Derby) and Hakim (10 wins).

This is the also the family of top Australian winners, Beefy T (1:56.7, 15 wins & \$369,331), Our Aynsley (31 wins), Astral Francais (32 wins) and Allwoods Chief (1:54.4, 40 wins & \$465,497).
