IT'S A WALK IN THE PARK FOR JAZZ BROMAC ON PREMIER NIGHT

Smart Live Or Die mare Jazz Bromac made it look like she was out for a stroll in the Sky City Mobile Pace at Alexandra Park last Friday night.

On a night that pretty much belonged to the fairer sex, hers was the easiest victory of all, but the ever increasing margin of 6 lengths did not come after the easiest of runs.

Starting from the outside of the mobile in the 2700m event, she was not hussled out at the start, instead settling for the rear position and being given a chance to find her feet.

Sent forward at speed at the 1800m she zipped around the field to take up a position in the open where she stayed quiet until the 400m mark approached. At that point leader Direct Surprise was taking no prisoners with the pace he was setting and halfway down the back had actually split the field with only 2 horses in touch with him.

Jazz Bromac made her move before the home turn and hit the lead at the top of the straight and the further they went, the bigger the gap between her and the rest of the field.

Her end margin of 6 lengths belied the fact that she had spent much of the race in the death and the resulting stakes won took her lifetime earnings into the shadows of \$50,000.

An ultra consistent mare Jazz Bromac has now won 4 races and finished in the first five in 19 of her 24 starts to date. Good enough to place in the **Group One Nevele R Fillies Series** as a 3YO, she also finished a good fourth to the big winning trio of One Dream, Running On Faith and Top Tempo in the **Listed GN Breeders Stakes** at Alexandra Park last December.

Jazz Bromac is the first foal of unraced Falcon Seelster mare Jasmine Bromac, whose second foal – 3YO filly Jonty Bromac, was an easy winner at Gore in December. Jasmine Bromac is a half sister to 1:54.2 winner **Justine Bromac** (\$109,222 25 wins) who is at stud in the US with her first foal also being a 1:54 winner. It is a family where winners abound, the most famous of them being dual **Inter Dominion Australian champion Hondo Grattan** who also numbered the G1 NSW Miracle Mile amongst his 58 wins, whilst racing in that superb 70's era of super star pacers.
