## DIXIE BROMAC WHISTLING HER RETURN ALL THE WAY TO THE LINE

**Dixie Bromac** showed why it's worth being patient if you have a mare with a lot of potential, when she won well at the Gold Coast yesterday.

The six year old mare has been off the scene since winning easily on the same track May 21st of last year, but returned with a touch of class in the Radio TAB 1008AM Mares Pace.

Vying for favouritism with **Miss Ruby Tuesday** who drew 3 on the front row, **Dixie Bromac** sat three wide for the early part of the race after drawing 2 on the second row.

Moving to the death with over a lap to run, she proved too strong in the run home despite her eight month absence from the track.

The 1609m mobile was covered in a time of 1:59.3 with the last quarter in 28.3.

It was **Dixie Bromac**'s 9th win from just 18 starts. She has been super consistent with her nine other starts boasting the superb record of 6 seconds, a third, a fifth and in her lone NZ start – a fourth.

She has a fastest time of 1:58.9 to date.

Her dam **Dawn Bromac** was unraced, but has already produced four winners from her first four foals. **Dixie Bromac** is her first foal. Her second foal was the **Red River Hanover** winning filly **After Dusk** who has won 2 Australian races to date and placed as a 3YO in the Daintys Daughter Classic Prelude. Next up was the **Badlands Hanover** filly **Incendio**, who after placing in the **G1** WA Diamond Classic at 2 and taking a sub 2:00 record at the same age, has lowered her record to 1:57.8 in WA this season.

**Dawn Bromac**'s fourth foal was her first colt and that is the promising **P Forty Seven** three year old **Dougie Bromac** who qualified at 2 and has taken a 1:59.5 record at three this season.

Since then **Dawn Bromac** has produced a **Badlands Hanover** current 2YO in **Panama Bromac**; a **Righteous Hanover** filly yearling **Bromac Del Mar** and a weanling colt by **P Forty Seven**.
