CAPTAIN BROMAC EASY IN OPENER AT GLOUCESTER PARK

Falcon Seelster gelding **Captain Bromac** capped a recent run of good placed form with an easy win in the opening event at Gloucester Park on their recent "Italian" night (Nov 12).

Drawn wide at 7 over the 2506m mobile event, **Captain Bromac** went forward from the gate to be sitting 3 wide into the first bend before progressing to sit outside the leader.

He got cover before the first lap had finished and stayed there for much of the race. Things got a little tight hitting the bell lap when he was suddenly surrounded by horses, but driver McCarthy managed to flick him out to the three wide line in time to avoid the struggling **Parasite** carrying him back through the field and then dropped him back into the 1-1 sit before getting him out and into a challenging position at the 400m mark.

From there it was just a matter of when he got to the front and how much he won by.

The final margin was an ever increasing three metres over the pacemaking **Surfin Superstar** with **Jimmy Kelly** less than a metre back.

Time for the 2506m journey was 3:05.9 with the mile rating a 1:59.4 mark.

Another member of this well performed family to add their name to the "honour roll" recently is the closely related **Coltrane Bromac**. Also by **Falcon Seelster**, his dam is **Captain Bromac**'s half sister **Crown Defender (Life Sign)**.

Coltrane Bromac has been ultra consistent to date and finished fast along the rails in the NZ 3YO Sires Stakes Silver at Ashburton during NZ Cup week to take third placing in a time of 1:54.2.

He has finished in the first 5 placings in all six starts to date.

Crown Bromac, a half brother to **Captain Bromac** is another to be in good form lately with his most recent starts being a win at Albion Park and a third at Harold Park last week in his heat of the Iraklis Championship series.
