ANOTHER WA TRIFECTA FOR THE BROMACS

Last week they dominated the card at Horsham when three Bromac starters produced three fine wins and this week it was the same number fronting up for the same result.

What was even more impressive was that it was a totally different set of horses. Didn't matter though – the Bromac gang still proved too tough in the end.

First up was **Golden Bromac**. This tough customer had already run twice since the others won at Horsham a week ago. He showed his class when winning at Gloucester Park the day after Horsham – his fourth start in just eleven days and his second win.

This time he drew the outside of the front row and after being restrained at the start, made a three wide run to sit in the death seat. He sat there until going head to head with the leader at the 600m mark. Heading him just before the home turn he proved too strong once again and held off a fast finishing **Gregan Marshall**, who had had a cosy trail until working off the leaders back when the speed went on at the 600m.

This was **Golden Bromac**'s third win from 6 starts in 19 days. It has to be said though, he is still looking for clear racing space in his other three starts (all at Gloucester Park).

Second up was the very promising **Jade Bromac**. This Live or Die 4YO mare had four NZ starts for a win and three placings, including two in sub 2:00.

She was exported to Australia last December but saw little luck in her first three starts and was turned out.

There was enough talk around however to see her start a clear favourite and after being handy early, took the lead at the bell lap. That was where she stayed and took a clear win without her driver getting the whip out.

She covered the 2030m race in 2:37.5 with a last half in 58.1.

Last up for the Bromac's was the extremely promising filly **Esprit Bromac**. This **Four Starzzz Shark** filly showed a toughness beyond her experience when finishing third in a heat of the WA Oaks at only her third start. Balloted out of the **Group 1** Oaks, she gained a deserved start with a late scratching and showed her potential again with a classy third in the black type event.

Bunbury was her second start since then and she was a commanding favourite. Drawn three she took the lead at the start and was never in doubt, coming home well clear of a spread out field.

She covered the 2100m in a time of 2:37.4, rating 2:00.6 for the mile and even last quarters of 29.5.
